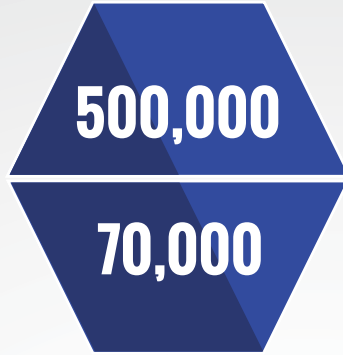

## A Nursing Shortage in Texas

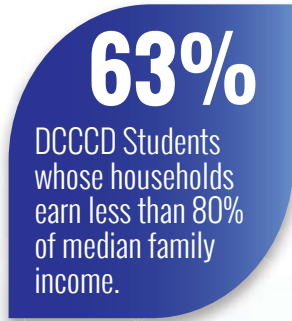


The nursing shortage predicted in the United States by 2021.

## JHG Texas Gives Back

With thanks to our generous donors, the JHG Texas Nursing Scholarship Program is growing rapidly!

During our 2017 - 2018 kickoff, JHG Texas granted \$25,000 to create five \$5,000 nursing scholarships, at two Dallas area nursing schools. Our grants provided three scholarships at DCCCD Nursing Schools and two scholarships at the nationally ranked TWU College of Nursing (Dallas campus).
